2014 Alzheimer Society Research Program Announcement

1. What is the "ASRP"?

The Alzheimer Society Research Program (ASRP) provides grants and awards to applicants based in Canadian Universities and affiliated institutions; that promise new insights into causes, prevention, diagnosis, treatment and management of Alzheimer's disease and other dementias (ADOD).

The ASRP focuses on two research streams:

- i. Biomedical: research into basic biological mechanisms related to brain changes associated with the disease and into the identification of therapeutic agents to combat the disease
- ii. Quality of Life (QoL): research into aspects of dementia care, support and means to improve the way care is experienced by people with dementia living in long term care homes, and their families.

2. What we have to offer:

Doctoral	22,000/year	3 years	Within first 18 months of PhD program
Post Doctoral	\$41,500/year (PhD) \$51,500/year (MD)	2 years	Within 12 months of obtaining PhD (extension may be given to MDs).
Young Investigator Grant	\$60,000 (QoL) \$75,000 (Biomedical)	3 years	Within the first 2 years of initial faculty position
Research Grant	\$60,000 (QoL) \$75,000 (Biomedical)	2 years	Must hold a faculty position with a Canadian university or affiliated institution

Awards: Doctoral and Postdoctoral awards are intended to support a new generation of bright scientists pursuing careers in the field of ADOD.

Grants: Young Investigator and Regular Grants are intended to support the work of new researchers who are entering the field of ADOD as well as already established investigators.
