The Forum will be attended by NBSPRN membership which includes senior policymakers, civil servants, researchers and administrative representatives from the province's four universities, provincial community organizations and NGOs as well as engaged citizens.

Please prepare your submission using the following format:

1) Cover page including:

• Your name and contact information including your affiliation and the name of your

research team.

- The title of the submitted work.
- Please indicate whether your work will be submitted as a paper or as a poster.

2) An abstract/summary of the work (250 word maximum).
