We are seeking abstracts for presentations and posters on projects that have contributed to (or show promise of) increasing organizational capacity, evaluating, and transforming programs and services through the use of data and academic research with the aim of enhancing public safety in New Brunswick. Two types of presentations will be accepted:

- Lightning Talk presentation (5-7 minutes)
- Poster

We welcome abstract submissions (maximum 250 words) outlining your proposed lightning talk presentation, or a poster. Please indicate your selection in the title of your abstract. Proponents of accepted abstracts will be invited to present during the event. Those proposing a presentation will be invited to give a lightning talk (5-7 minutes). Proponents of accepted posters will be asked to prepare their full poster (37" X 41") for the event.

Notifications will be ongoing during the review process, however, a full agenda will not be decided until after the final deadline for submissions.
